A Message from Pastor Gary

And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.
[Acts 2:2]

On the Day of Pentecost, many years ago, the sound of the rush of the wind ushered in something new. As if the doors and windows of a stuffy building were opened to the fresh air of change, so the Holy Spirit spilled into the room where they were sitting. From this event we say the church was born. Something new took place in that room and it spread to every corner of the world.

We are the heirs of that legacy; we are the Church, the body of Christ. We are called to share the Gospel and to live in fellowship with one another. We continue the story of that first Pentecost whenever we gather for worship. Called to share the Gospel, we are always seeking the best ways to use our resources for the tasks before us. Our high calling to bear witness to Christ is also our calling to be alert to the necessity of change when those changes will benefit the mission and ministry of the congregation.

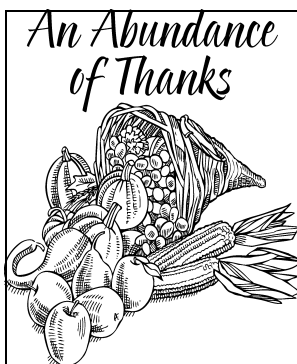
I am excited to share with you some proposed changes that will make Bethlehem stronger. I invite you to look at these proposals, pray and consider how these changes will make our ministries robust. This proposal has 4 parts; please take time to understand how those parts work separately and together for 2012. These proposals will affect our budget and so will be part of our discussion at Annual Meeting Part 1 in December.

Proposal 1: Newsletter Changes.

- Allow our bulk mailing permit to expire in January 2012
- Replace the bulk mail with the following:
 - + People wishing a printed copy can pick one up at church or have it mailed first class at a subscription rate of \$12.00 per year.
 - + People wishing to read the newsletter online can access the newsletter via the church website. This also holds an archive of previous newsletters.
 - + Shut-ins will receive their newsletters by first class mail (the savings generated by ending bulk mail are more than adequate to cover these costs.)

Pastor's Message *(continued)*

Proposal 2: Support staff work hour reduction.

- Custodian, secretary and receptionist (Friday and Saturday) will each roll back their hours by 25% to reduce payroll costs.
- Custodian's time and pay will be reduced by 25%.
- Secretary will work 16 hours per week year round (approximately 25% reduction).
- Friday – Saturday receptionist will work 9:30 am to 12:30 pm (25% reduction from current hours of 9:00 am – 1:00 pm).

Proposal 3: Program staff salary freeze, program cost reduction.

- Pastor, musician, and bell choir director will remain at 2010 salary level (no pay increases were given in 2011).
- Committee budgets will be reduced by 10%.

Proposal 4: Congregational giving increase.

- The proposed changes will allow the council to set the 2012 spending plan at a level \$68,000.00 less than 2011. Much prayer and thought has been put into this proposal.
- Responding positively to this proposal with a 5% to 10% increase in your offerings will strengthen our efforts to use our resources as wisely as possible for the sake of the Gospel.

The rationales behind these proposals are simple: 1) reducing our costs is prudent during these fiscally tough times. At the same time cuts alone will not accomplish fiscal reliability. The proposals are balanced – seeking both cuts in spending and increases in revenue; and, 2) giving to Bethlehem has been flat since 2009. While utility and maintenance costs continue to rise, our ability to meet those expenses has not kept pace.

Please use the examples in this chart to help determine your giving level for 2012.

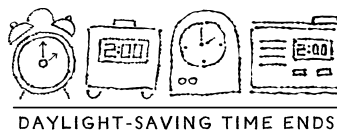

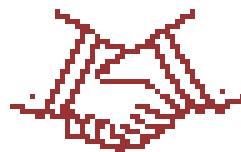

Council Meeting Minutes October 11, 2011

Present: Annette Johns, Van O'Brien, Pastor Gary Erickson, Anna Fischer, Maria McMillion, Gordon Rasmussen, Bill Gulke, Tammie Farley

Call to Order – Annette Johns (in lieu of Beth Metzler) called the meeting to order at 6:39pm.

Approval of Agenda – Van O'Brien moved to approve the agenda, seconded by Anna Fischer. The Council approved the agenda.

Approval of Minutes – Van O'Brien moved to approve the minutes to the September 2011 Council Meeting, seconded by Gordon Rasmussen. The Council approved the minutes.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Gary's report included the following:

Valerie Talsma has assumed the position of 7th and 8th grade teacher.

Pastor Gary wanted to remind the Council and the congregation to adhere to the process of major purchases using Church funds. It is important to consult the Council and the Treasurer (Tammie Farley) prior to major purchases to ensure that funds are, or could be made available.

Pastor Gary laid out a four-step stewardship proposal to help reduce costs for the coming year:

Eliminate bulk mail permit & mailings. In doing so, the newsletter would be posted online, via email, and/or available by hand at the church. Shut-ins and out-of-towners would still get the newsletter via first class mail, while others would need to subscribe.

25% reduction in support staff hours, which would realize a savings of \$3,000/year; freeze salaries for program staff; ask every giving

household to give 5-10% more in the coming year.

Gordon Rasmussen moved to have the aforementioned proposal approved by the Council and discuss the proposal with the congregation at the December annual meeting for implementation in January for the 2012 budget; seconded by Maria McMillion. The Council approved the motion.

Pastor Gary scheduled a meeting in Rockford with another American as a follow-up to the meeting in Denmark regarding the international partnership of the Arcot Lutheran Church. This is part of an ongoing process.

Property Committee (Anna Fischer) - The Property Committee has not met, but there has been positive feedback regarding the electronic bulletin board.

Evangelism & Stewardship (Pastor Gary) – The Stewardship committee met, while Evangelism has not. Offering envelopes are being prepared for the next year.

Worship & Music (Pastor Gary) – This committee is continuing to meet, and is working on Christmas worship. Christmas and New Years are on Sunday this year, and there will be one worship services instead of two on those days.

Social Ministry (Annette Johns) - The food pantry served 2,365 persons/688 households in September 2011. 205 of those households got food with food stamps. The 100 turkey boxes have been ordered.

Finance – (Tammie Farley) Financial discussions included:

- Tammie Farley asked the Council to withdraw \$4200 from the Thrivent fund to pay off outstanding bills, due to decreased gifts. Doing so would leave \$70,000 left in the fund. Gordon Rasmussen moved to withdraw the fund, seconded by Anna Fischer; the Council approved the motion.

A proposed 2012 budgetary plan was introduced to the Council. The budget aligns the distribution of gifts closer to the reception of gifts based on this year's returns. A more refined budget proposal will be brought to the November Council meeting which also takes into account Pastor Gary's proposal.

Mission Endowment (Pastor Gary) - Gifts will be disbursed on October 23rd. The committee also needs a new chairperson.

Old Business – The following old business was discussed:

- Gordon Rasmussen, Bill Gulke, Myron Bond, and Lysa Wright will have their terms on the Council expire at the end of the year. The Nominating Committee is working on filling these seats. There was discussion about possibly adding three seats to the Council for a total of 12, but no motion was made.

- The Vision Task Force met on October 13th, and had a good discussion regarding long term growth of the Church.

Staff has been contacted with request to locate job descriptions and update them before October 28th. The next step in the staff evaluation process will be to schedule meetings with each staff member for open dialog about job tasks, etc.

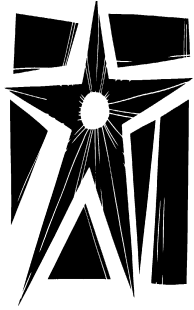
New Business – The following new business was discussed:

A new counter was needed and required nomination by the Council. Bill Gulke was nominated as a temporary counter; motion by Annette Johns and seconded by Anna Fischer. The Council approved the motion.

Next Meeting - The next council meeting is set for Tuesday, November 8th at 6:30 pm.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:31.

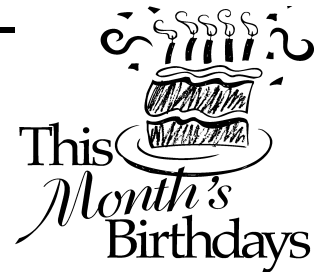
