## A Message from Pastor Gary

*But when the goodness and loving-kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. [Titus 3: 4-7]*

By virtue of your baptism you entered the Church, the body of Christ. The Church is a partnership, an organization that accompanies a person from birth until death. But our accompaniment does not stop with the individual; individuals make congregations, congregations form denominations, denominations form the Church of Christ throughout the world. By virtue of your baptism you are a member of a very large family – a worldwide partnership knit together by the Holy Spirit.

Our vision is limited. The part of the Church we most often see and interact with is our own congregation. It is easy to make the mistake of thinking the Church of Christ is limited to what we can see. The cure for this error is to open our eyes and hearts to our worldwide partnership.

Sometimes these questions are asked, “but isn’t there enough to do here? Can’t we just take care of ourselves?” To which the answer can only be, “There is plenty to do here, and we must take care of ourselves, but we are called to care for our neighbors, to be active members of our partnership.” The Church cannot last long with myopia; such nearsightedness can only be overcome by returning to the waters of baptism and remembering the worldwide partnership to which we were called.

We all multi-task: we do several or many things at the same time. Remember the last meal you shared with friends and you will see that you talked, ate, drank, and laughed. What a dreadful life if we could do only one thing at a time. The Church also multi-tasks: we can take care of

ourselves and our neighbors at the same time. We can do mission locally and globally at the same time. In fact, the local mission inspires the global mission, while the global mission informs and inspires the local mission.

Martin Luther referred to the human desire to only seek one's own best interest as *incurvatus in se*; turning in on oneself. This was also his definition of sin. For Luther the way of overcoming sin was to work with and for others – to celebrate our partnership that began in baptism.

From July 25 through August 5, I met with people from the Arcot Lutheran Church. Our face to face meetings, our conversations, our walking together, sharing meals, and discovering new things about one another were all acts of partnership based in baptism. The Northern Illinois Synod, a partnership of 150 congregations, has had a relationship with the Arcot Lutheran Church since 2008.

Let's celebrate our partnerships, begun in baptism, carried forward with prayer, mutual blessings for all involved.

### FAMINE IN THE HORN OF AFRICA

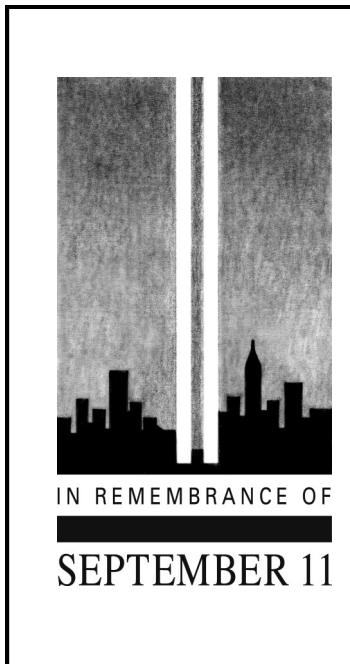

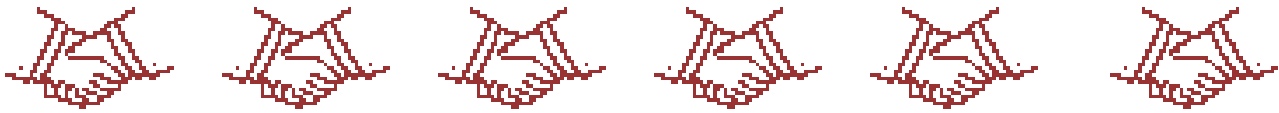

## Property Committee Activities

Recently a priority poll was taken by the Property Committee members and Church Council to provide guidance to the Property Committee as to preferences of people concerning the many projects that have been discussed in the past two years.

The top three for the participants were the parking lot, cutting down the dead tree on the north edge of the back parking lot, and shortening some pews for wheelchairs and/or walkers.

Following the preferences of the poll responders, the Property Committee brought out the bids received two years ago for the parking lot resealing and designated committee members to check on the current status of those bids. Bids for the tree cutting are being sought. Bill Gulke feels we could do the job ourselves if we have someone to grind up the cut material.

The shortening pew project is on hold.

Of the projects that did not receive high priority, a couple have already been done. The staining of the outside wall on the east side of the building will be done by volunteers.

Other activity involves a sub-group of property that has been looking at ways to enhance and improve our entryway, hall and fellowship hall. One idea that caught immediate attention and enthusiasm was to put an electronic bulletin board in the entryway. This would provide information about what is going on, activities of interest, scheduled meetings, etc.

The Council approved using memorial funds for this project. The sub-group went to Best Buy to make a selection and the board will be installed very early in September. At the time of installation, Best Buy will also provide instruction on how to use the new communication board.

The sub-group members are Joan Truckenbrod, Marilyn Hongisto, Maria McMillion and Anna Fischer. This group provided the stimulus for the fantastic display of Indian photos that have been up during July and August. Hopefully, more displays of interest will fill the hall.

These committees are always looking for additional help. In August, Jesse Schramer joined the group. He is a most welcome addition.

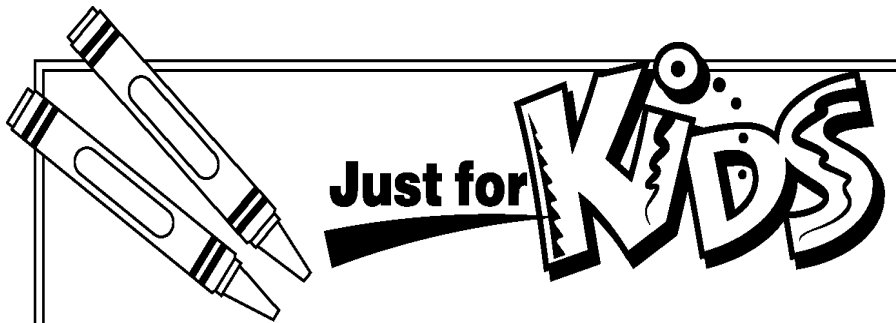

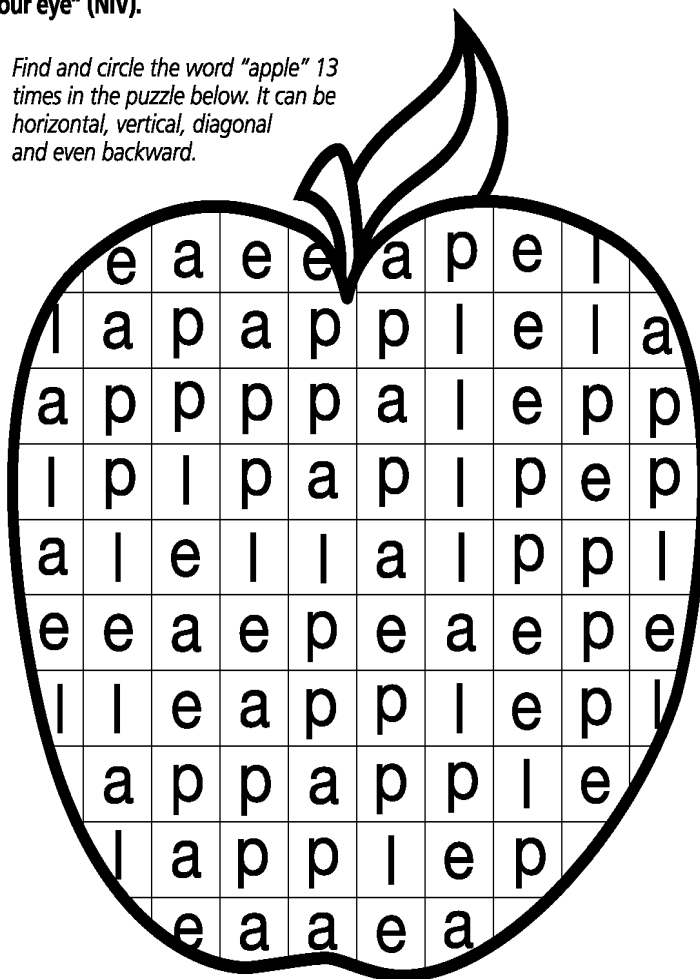

## Apple of Your Eye

When something is said to be the "apple of your eye," it means it's precious to you and you would protect it as you would your own eye. ## Easy Applesauce Muffins

This healthy recipe will make a great start to your day, a great snack or a great gift for your teacher and classmates.

### What you need:

- 6 tablespoons butter
- 1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs
- 2/3 cup brown sugar
- 1 1/2 cups chunky applesauce
- Baking cups



### What you do:

1. With an adult's help, heat the oven to 375 degrees. Line a 12-cup muffin tin with baking cups and set aside.
2. In a small, microwave-safe bowl, melt the butter on high for about 30 seconds; set aside to cool slightly.
3. Sift together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon and salt in to a large mixing bowl.
4. In another large bowl, whisk together the eggs and brown sugar. Stir in the applesauce and melted butter until the mixture is smooth.
5. Pour the apple mixture over the flour mixture. Stir with a wooden spoon just until the flour disappears. (This will produce muffins with a nice, crumbly texture.)
6. Fill the baking cups about two-thirds full with batter. (For mess-free muffins, use an ice-cream scoop to spoon batter into the baking cups.)
7. Bake for 20 minutes or until light brown. Test for doneness by inserting a toothpick in the middle; if it comes out clean, the muffins are ready to eat. Makes 12.

# September Stewardship

## August-September Stewardship Emphasis Riso Duplicator

A duplicator differs from a copy machine in the way it produces copies. Duplicators do not rely on heat to make copies and can therefore run faster with less expense. However, both a copy machine and a duplicator are needed in our office.

The current Risograph Duplicator was purchased in 1997. After producing 1,943,824 copies using 17,499 masters, our Riso broke down and is not repairable. Riso stopped making replacement parts for their 1997 machines in 2006. We were fortunate that the few times we needed repairs there were still parts in the repair shop. But this last time our good fortune ran out – no more parts are available for the duplicator that has served us so well.

Integra Business Systems is currently offering a great incentive on a new duplicator. For \$3,495 plus our old machine we can be back to high speed and inexpensive duplicating. Your help in meeting this need is greatly appreciated!

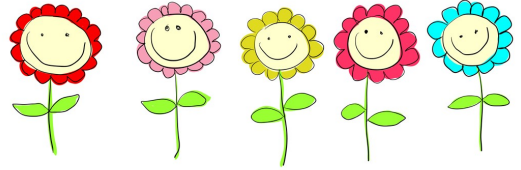

## August Council Minutes

Present: Beth Metzler, Annette Johns, Van O'Brien, Pastor Gary Erickson, Mary Lasits, Anna Fischer, Maria McMillion, Gordon Rasmussen, Lysa Wright

Call to Order – Beth Metzler called the meeting to order at 6:35pm.

Approval of Agenda – Gordon Rasmussen moved to approve the agenda, seconded by Lysa Wright. The Council approved the agenda.

Approval of Minutes – Van O'Brien moved to approve the minutes to the June 2011 Council meeting, seconded by Maria McMillion. Council approved the minutes.

Director of Youth and Outreach – Mary Lasits announced her resignation, effective at the end of the month. She has accepted a position in Central Ohio as a Director of Congregational Relations. Her last Sunday will be August 28<sup>th</sup>. As a result, her position in the Council will be vacated, as well as her Synod seat. She also reported that Vacation Bible School was going well with an attendance of around 65 children per day.

Mary will schedule a meeting on Thursday the 11<sup>th</sup> to discuss the transition as it pertains to Christian Education. Teachers almost in place for fall.

Pastor's Report – Pastor Gary's report included the following:

- Pastor Gary reminded the Council of upcoming vacation days:
  - o August 21<sup>st</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>
  - o August 29<sup>th</sup> through September 5<sup>th</sup> – Pastor Gary will be attending a partners meeting in Denmark related to the Arcot Lutheran Church in India. Pastor Diane may be called upon to substitute during worship
- Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup> will be a Synod Discipleship Gathering for the Northeast Conference at BELC

Property Committee – (Anna Fischer)

- One of the church's vacuums was lost and returned broken without knowledge of how it was returned in its condition. The Property Committee will be looking into getting a second vacuum cleaner for public use; possibly a shopvac for downstairs.
- Anna handed out a survey to the Council to prioritize issues coming up with the Property committee.
- Annette Johns moved to have an electronic bulletin board installed in the front lobby of the church, seconded by Anna Fischer. The Council approved the motion. The electronic bulletin board will be used to scroll through events and announcements at BELC as well as any other information that needs to be posted for all to see. This is part of continuing efforts to modernize BELC. The bulletin board will be paid for from Memorial Funds

Social Ministry – (Annette Johns)

- The food pantry served 2,301 persons/828 households in June 2011
- The food pantry served 1,825 persons/625 households in July 2011

Mission Endowment – (Lysa Wright)

- The Mission Endowment Committee met on Monday, August 8<sup>th</sup>, and all disbursements have been allocated for the year.
- The committee is interested in being audited. Anna Fischer moved to have the Mission Endowment Committee audited by the church Audit Committee, seconded by Maria McMillion. The Council approved the motion.
- Annette Johns moved to have an electronic bulletin board installed in the front lobby of the church, seconded by Anna Fischer. The Council approved the motion. The electronic bulletin board will be used to scroll through events and announcements at BELC as well as any other information that needs to be posted for all to see. This is part of continuing efforts to modernize BELC. The bulletin board will be paid for from Memorial Funds.
- A list of the allocated disbursements will be prepared for the September Council meeting for review and approval.

Old Business – The following old business was discussed:

- Sean Blobaum from Thrivent came to the BELC and informed members of the Thrivent Choice program. Most importantly the congregation was informed that the funds can be put back toward BELC if each member chooses.
- The Council will start getting names together for members of the vision task force discussed at the last meeting.
- The Council will put together evaluations for staff in the coming month.
- The following activities and events were formally announced to the Council:
  - o June 19<sup>th</sup>, the congregation's graduates will be honored during service
  - o July 10<sup>th</sup> – Thrivent associate will be at Adult Forum
  - o July 17<sup>th</sup> – First communion for young members
  - o A display about the ELC's mission work in India is on display in the main hallway.

New Business – The following new business was discussed:

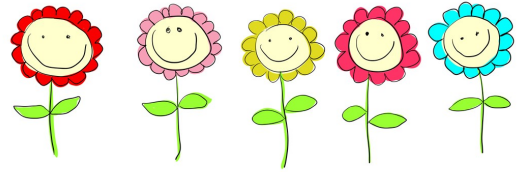
- The fourteen year old copier in the office has broken down and parts are no longer available. The BELC's copy machine supplier is offering a fair deal of +/- \$3,500 for a new machine. Pastor Gary suggested that the funds will be borrowed from the Memorial Fund and paid back over time. Anna Fischer made a motion to this effect, seconded by Lysa Wright. The Council approved the motion.
- Lifeline Screening will be using the BELC again on November 29<sup>th</sup>. The Council approved this request.
- The Council approved the appointment of Barb Luchsinger to serve as offering counter to fill June Whitney's vacated position.
- A discussion of BELC's policy of reaching out to church members and families in need was discussed. The Council was reminded that the Good Samaritan fund allows for three \$300 gifts to be disbursed throughout one calendar year. In more dire circumstances, additional funds can be found.
- The Council discussed filling of roles in the absence of Mary Lasits. In the short term, it was suggested that the Church could pay for four hours a week for a care coordinator.
- A formal inventory of existing committees and their members is going to be assembled in the coming weeks to serve as a point of reference for the Council as well as the congregation.

Next Meeting - The next council meeting is set for Tuesday, September 13<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm. Meeting was adjourned at 8:36. Minutes submitted by: Van O'Brien

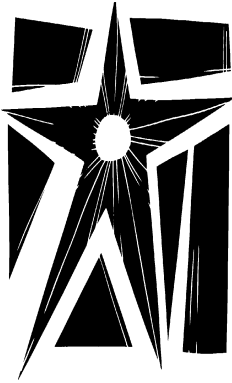
